Alta Vista Traffic Islands

The traffic islands at Breeden intersecting W. Kings Hwy and Gramercy are in commemoration of neighbors who have gone before us, and the Alta Vista Neighborhood Association wants to honor the traffic islands that are a special little spot in the neighborhood by beautifying and landscaping the islands to become pocket parks. With these funds we hope to create a place of respite where neighbors can gather and enjoy our community. Jimmy Contreras, one of Alta Vista's past Presidents, had been an active member of the association for many years. Much of the groundwork planning in Alta Vista had something to do with Jimmy. He was a member of the Neighborhood Planning Team and an active member of several AVNA committees. Jimmy was also a Master Gardener and would lend his marvelously landscaped backyard to many AVNA functions.

Jessica Zembala and her fiancé Allen Sikes touted the idea of landscaping the islands several years prior to her passing. Both Allen and Jessica were active members of the AVNA Zoning Committee and the Neighborhood Planning Committee. They shared a beautiful home close to the intersection of one of the proposed islands. Jessica and Allen had been avid Xeriscape gardeners and their yard was featured as a winner in a SAWS landscape tour.

Alta Vista lost Jimmy on Thanksgiving Day of in 2003, after a long illness. He was in his early fifties. Jessica passed away unexpectedly in April of the same year. She was 32 and was to wed Allen the next month.

In light of the pandemic and the hardships we have faced, Alta Vista is asking that the community come together in an effort to restore the traffic islands. The AVNA Board in 2003 raised funds and landscaped the islands in memory of Jimmy and Jessica. But for many years since, the islands have been neglected. The General Assembly voted in 2020 to "Adopt a Spot" and move forward with a landscaping project. In order to raise funds, we are having a Brick Fundraiser Campaign.

We're hoping that in February we'll be able to start with the ground breaking. Community work days will be scheduled through March to bring us together and celebrate each other; even if we're still safely social distancing then.

Laurel Heights United Methodist Church

(227 W. Woodlawn) has set up a free WiFi hotspot in their Woodlawn parking lot. The hotspot is available from 6am to 10pm. They hope this resource will be a blessing to their neighbors and be one small step toward bridging the digital divide in San Antonio. The AVNA Board of Directors has worked very hard reviewing the results of the survey that was circulated last August. There were only 80 returned and that is only 6% of our neighborhood population. However, those voices were critical to shaping our objectives. The Zoning and Planning Committee (what was called the Technical Committee) will be focused on property taxes as a special assignment. D1 has already been notified that sidewalks are still an issue and that Alta Vista is still not included in the city's Capital Improvement Plan. We're going to continue to improve communication and let you know about specific issues that pose challenges to our neighbors, especially regarding Code and SAFFE. There were several requests for more information regarding development, but there are not large scale development projects planned for Alta Vista. However, the neighborhood is currently in the discovery phase of the Large Area Rezoning review by DSD. Community input meetings will be scheduled as soon as we have that coordination with DSD. If you missed what that is all about then please find the November 2020 newsletter archived on our website to read all about it. When specific properties have zoning change requests or something of that nature then we'll make sure that we get that information out so that you're aware of those types of actions, along with what the Board decisions are, or whether we submit a response to the city. Information doesn't always correspond with the physical newsletter publications, that are every other month. Please sign up for our email eblasts so that you are getting information in between. And there is guite a bit of interest in reading stories about other neighbors, businesses, the park, and our neighborhood's history. We're going to bring back the "spotlight" section of the newsletter and hope to find a way to make the Cultural Committee a reality this year.

The day to day life in Alta Vista plays out on our Facebook group page. Please request to join to be a part of the activity. Active property issues are ongoing at 800 W. Russell. We recently found out, in days after the fire, that it has made it to the City Attorney's Public Defenders' office. It still has to make its way to Bexar County for it to be auctioned. Across the street, 2602 N Flores, "Patsy's", has been sold and the new owner has initiated a request for historic landmark designation. It is currently on the HDRC agenda for January 20th.

More business, info, and updates will be provided at the General Assembly Meeting on the 27th at 6:30pm. You do not have to be a member to join the meetings! Membership dues pay our operational expenses and members vote on Association matters. Please join us, your input is what makes us a community and gives voice to our neighborhood!
